## MARYVALE COUNCIL STRATEGIC PLAN 2019-2024

The Diocesan Trustees have requested the Maryvale Council consider options for the future of Maryvale. In weighing up various options it has been clearly stated that financial support from the Diocese cannot continue at the current rate (total of ca £0.3m of direct grants and underwriting the operating deficit).

Future plans for Maryvale will also need to be fully aligned with the unfolding Diocesan Pastoral Plan. This plan has formation as one its four key themes, and also recognises that collaborative ministry will be at the heart of parish life going forward. The Diocesan Vision is for the involvement of many more lay people in the life of the Church. To achieve this formation for both clergy and lay people will become ever more central to our life as a Church.

Repositioning the activities of Maryvale to support this need within the Diocese and in a financially sustainable way are key to building a successful future. Maryvale has also played an important role in providing highly regarded formation opportunities to lay people in other dioceses and to those overseas. Any future plans will be primarily driven by the need to support the formation needs of Birmingham Archdiocese however that does not exclude Maryvale continuing to develop its offer to those beyond the diocese in support of the worldwide Church.

There are three parts to the plan for Maryvale, and in setting out this plan it is necessary to draw a distinction between the activities of the Maryvale Institute, and Maryvale the location/property.

- 1. Adult formation for the Diocese
- 2. Higher Education formation opportunities for the people of the Diocese and the wider Church
- 3. Maryvale the Place
- 1. Adult Formation: Under the leadership of Bishop David Evans, to form a committee to consider the shape of this provision.

  The Committee to consist of
  - Director of Education Service
  - Head of Formation Theme from Diocesan Plan
  - Director of Further Education Maryvale
  - Head of Communications from the Diocese

The program for adult formation shall consider:

- The impact of Covid pandemic on society and the way in which adults will interact with the Church
- A prudent approach to make good use of the resources available to the Diocese
- Ambitious in engaging with a wide audience of adults through a variety of means and locations

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- 2. Higher Education of Adults through validated courses:
  - Ensure all academic programs are financially sustainable
  - Ensure validation partners are appropriate and internationally recognised
  - Academic leadership is of good standing and independent
  - Students are satisfied with the provision and feedback is acted upon.
- 3. Maryvale the building

The Maryvale building is of great historic interest to the Diocese and also has connection with the recently canonized St John Henry Newman. The building is listed but the residential accommodation provided is not of the standard expected.

- Ensure the building is used to the greatest benefit of the Diocese
- Reassess the role of the Bridgettine Convent and their charisma of hospitality
- As the seat of Maryvale Institute that the library and academic teaching spaces are appropriate and to the adequate standard.
